Session Proceedings:

She identified key strategic investment areas such as clean technology, sustainable infrastructure, and renewable energy, and stressed the need for integrating sustainability into corporate strategy through alignment of ESG goals with financial objectives and adoption of integrated reporting frameworks. Additionally, the role of universities and research institutions was underscored in promoting sustainability through innovation and bridging the gap between academia and industry. She concluded by aligning these practices with the vision of Viksit Bharat 2047, emphasising inclusive growth, environmental sustainability, and responsible governance, and asserting that collaborative efforts among corporations, policymakers, and academia are essential for building a resilient, sustainable economy.

Professor Navsin Mistry, Principal, M V Mandali's College of Commerce and Science, University of Mumbai, Mumbai, in her address at the conference, extended her sincere congratulations to the organisers for

the successful conduct of the event. She made special mention of Professor Meenu Maheshwari, appreciating her dedication, leadership, and significant contributions in organizing the conference.
